AN ORDINANCE ABANDONING CERTAIN STREETS AND ALLEYS LOCATED WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF DANBURY, TEXAS, AND CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS IN CONNECTION TELREWITH.

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council of the City of Danbury, Texas, that it would be to the best interest of the public for the hereinafter described streets and alleys to be vacated, closed and abandoned, and for the property therein contained to be conveyed to the abutting property owners;

Now, Therefore, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Danbury, Brazoria County, Tollas, at a regular meeting with a Quorum Present, as follows, towat:

- 1. That the following strates and unlays by, and they are hereby, vacated, closed and abandoned as streets and alleys, being described as:
  - a. That certain unnamed alloy which runs through block 7, from First Street to Second Street, and through Block 10, from Second Street to Third Street;
  - b. That certain unnamed alls; which read through Block 8, from First Street to Second Street; and through Block 17, from Second Street to Third Street;
  - c. Avenue G, from the north west boundary line of First Street to the south east boundary line of Third Street;
  - d. Avenue H, from the north west boundary line of First Street to the south corner of Lot 9, Block 17;
  - e. Second Street, from the south west boundary line of Avenue F to the west corner of Lot 1, Block 9; and,
  - f. That certain unnamed alley which runs through Block 92, from Seventh Street to Eighth Street,
  - all as set out on the map or plat of the City of Danbury, Brazoria County, Texas, as recorded in the Plat Ciffice of said County.
- 2. The City Council, by and through the Mayor and City Secretery is hereby authorized to execute deeds to the abandoned property to the abutting landowners.
- 3. Whereas, an emergency is created by the streets and alleys remaining one, and the public peace, health, safety and general welfare necessitate that this Ordinance become effective at once, it is accordingly Ordained that this Ordinance become effective immediately upon its passage, and shall take effect and be in force from said passage.
