## Mayor's Trash Patrol

In an effort to help promote community involvement, and to help keep the City of Danbury clean of trash, the Friends of Danbury Civic Club have offered to sponsor the "Mayor's Trash Patrol."

The participant will come to City Hall to sign a volunteer waiver and must be accompanied by their parent or guardian.

The participant will receive a marked trash bag from City Hall. The trash bag is to be used for trash along the road side, trash in ditch, and any debris that is found around town, but NOT from a person's yard or home.

The participant will return their full trash bag to City Hall. The trash bag is to be placed in the dumpster located behind City Hall.

Once the volunteer forms is filled out, a "Trash Patrol Card" will be issued and kept on file at City Hall. This card will be punched every time a full bag of trash is returned to City Hall. Once the card is punched 5 times, the participant will receive a certificate good for an item from the Two Czech Chicks Kolache Shoppe. Once the card receives two more additional punches, the participant will receive a certificate good for a snow cone or a cold drink from the Just Coffee Shop and after the card is punched for a total of 10 times, the participant will receive a certificate for lunch at Phillips Café.

5. Install safety devices: Install barriers, covers and alarms.
6. Get certified: Know how to perform CPR on children and adults.
